## H Is For Hawk (12A)

Screening from Friday 23 January

Dir: Philippa Lowthorpe UK 2026 115 mins

When Helen's (Claire Foy) beloved father passes away, she is knocked sideways by grief and loses herself in memories of their time birding and exploring the natural world together. She becomes obsessed with the idea of training her own goshawk, and so she brings the fearsome bird Mabel home to her life as a graduate fellow at Cambridge. Helen fills the freezer with hawk food and embarks on the long, strange business of trying to train this wildest of animals.



## Nouvelle Vague (12A)

A playful, poignant love letter to cinema, this film reimagines the making of Jean-Luc Godard's *Breathless* in an exuberant exploration of the youthful rebellion and creative chaos that shaped the French New Wave.



## The History Of Sound (15)

In 1917, Lionel (Paul Mescal)—a young, talented music student—meets David (Josh O'Connor) at the Boston Conservatory, where they bond over a deep love of folk music. Years later, Lionel receives a letter from David, leading to an impromptu journey through the backwoods of Maine to collect traditional songs. This unexpected reunion, ensuing love affair, and the music they collect and preserve, will shape the course of Lionel's life far beyond his own awareness.


## Shoot The Piano Player (12A) S




## Looney Tunes: The Day The Earth Blew Up (PG)

## Sham (Cert. TBC)

School teacher Yabushita Seiichi is devoted to his job. One day, he is accused by a boy's mother of brutally disciplining her allegedly mixed-race son. Despite insisting that he has no recollection of the incident and claiming it is completely untrue, Seiichi is forced by his headteacher to apologise publicly to the other parents. The gesture, however, fails to end the controversy. As public outrage grows, Seiichi is vilified and isolated, while Ritsuko garners sympathy and rallies support for an unprecedented civil lawsuit.



## Ghost Killer (Cert. TBC)

Dir: Sonomura Kensuke Japan 2024 104 mins

University student Matsuoka Fumika drunkenly trips in the street after an unsuccessful date. Pulling herself up, she notices a bullet casing lying on the ground and picks it up. When she returns home, she is shocked to see the ghostly owner of the empty bullet, Kudo Hideo, a legendary assassin who was recently murdered.

Terrified and in disbelief, Fumika discovers that by holding Hideo's hand, she is granted lethal combat skills she never had. But Hideo has unfinished business — to find out who killed him — and only Fumika can help.



## Silence Of The Sea (Cert. TBC)

Dir: Wakamatsu Setsuro Japan 2024 112 mins

World-renowned artist Tamura Shuzo celebrates his career with a major exhibition. When one of his works is exposed as a forgery, it throws the strictly codified art world of high-society into chaos.

As the media frenzy grows, the body of a mysterious tattooed woman is discovered in Hokkaido. The investigation uncovers a link between the two incidents in the shape of Tsuyama Ryuji, once hailed as a prodigy and Shuzo's rival, who vanished in disgrace years earlier.

Authorities instead arrest Dr. Akagi Masao, who performs gender-affirming operations, accusing him of violating the law. Meanwhile, Sachi is quietly planning her future. When defence attorney Kano Taku asks her to testify in court for Dr. Akagi, Sachi confronts her past and identity before a society unwilling to see her for who she really is.




## Silents Synced – R.E.M X Buster Keaton's Sherlock Jr (12A)

## Exhibition On Screen: Turner & Constable (Cert. TBC)

Celebrating the 250th anniversary of their births, this unmissable new documentary explores Turner and Constable's intertwined lives and legacies alongside the groundbreaking Tate exhibition.

Two of Britain's greatest painters, J.M.W. Turner and John Constable were also the greatest of rivals. Born within a year of each other, both used landscape painting to reflect the changing world around them. 
