Man Of Marble (U S)	Dir: Andrzej Wajda	Poland	1976	153 mins
In the 1970s, young filmmaker Agnieszka investigates the life of a 1950s bricklayer and worker's hero. When she learns that the facts behind his story were suppressed, she has to decide whether to pursue the truth or not. <i>Man of Marble</i> is a thought-provoking examination of the moral responsibility of an individual and art in challenging dominant ideology, censorship and oppressive authorities. Four turtles and a rat are transformed into a humanoid state by a mutagenetic gel in a sewer. The rat becomes their mentor, and teaches them all he knows regarding Jinjitsu and the turtles soon develop a love for pizza and begin to use their newfound skills to combat the crime in New York City. But when their mentor is captured by an enemy from the past, can Donatello, Michelangelo, Raphael and Leonardo hold true to what they've learned, and stay together as a brotherhood? Cowabunga!				
Time And Water (PG)	Sara Dosa	Iceland/USA	2026	93 mins
Renowned Icelandic poet and author Andri Snær Magnason is chasing something elusive. As the glacial ice of his homeland melts, he constructs a cinematic time capsule to hold onto this moment and send it to the future, before everything he loves slips away. Using his own collected archives, his grandparents' photographs, and films, as well as traditional songs and folktales, Andri interlaces his family's story with that of the land around him.

Haley Bennet and Jack Whitehall star in this adaptation Virginia Woolf's funniest novel, <i>Night & Day</i> is an un-romantic comedy about the passionate astronomer, Katharine Hilbert who does everything she can to avoid romantic love and marriage. Fun and contemporary in tone, this refreshing film showcases an ensemble of humorous performances against the ravishing backdrop of London in 1910, advances in science and technology and crumbling Edwardian patriarchy.
